Personal Note from Instructor:

"Jesus said 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." - John 14:6

There is a common belief in our culture that all religions lead to God. Is this true? Will Buddhism and Islam lead us to the same God that Christianity proclaims? In this course, students will study the claims of other religions in contrast to Christianity. In doing so, our students will discover the fundamental differences between Jesus and other gods, while preparing themselves to share the gospel with those who serve other gods.

Description:

Students will be studying the belief and practices of various world religions and cults by comparing and contrasting them to Biblical Christianity.

The Scriptures teach that the whole world lies in the power of the evil one (Satan). Therefore, the world's false religious philosophies are Satan's doing. They are led by false teachers that disguise themselves as teachers of the truth and doers of righteousness.

Sadly, Christian cults and various false world religions are experiencing growth.

This in-depth high school worldview course begins with a look at numerous worldviews, followed by a study of world religions from a Christian perspective, an overview of modern-day cults, and a look at worldview apologetics. The course concludes with an in-depth study of refuting a few modern-day cults previously introduced, as well as other pertinent and timely topics.
