Description:

This course is a survey of world religions, major cults, and other deviant doctrines that challenge the historic Christian Faith. Topics cover questions like:

- Why are there so many religions?
- Is there only one path to God, Heaven, and ultimate fulfillment?
- How does Christianity compare to other religions?
- Does it really matter what others believe?

Students will learn about various world religions and how their belief systems differ from Christianity. You will journey from Judaism to Islam, from LDS to Jehovah's Witnesses, and from New Age to Scientology.

In the first semester, students will learn the characteristics of a cult and discover what makes Christianity unique, true, and the only rational worldview. Students will be trained in how to defend the exclusive truth of Christianity as they study the basic beliefs of major cults and world religions followed by biblical critique.

In the second semester, the focus will be on Islam, Mormonism, and "Jehovah's Witnesses." Students will learn step-by-step methods of witnessing to those who knock on their door. They will know what to do from the moment they open the door and a "Jehovah's Witness" couple faces them.
